Preparations For Seyfert Camp 2010

This past fall in October, a group of hard working men began and nearly completed the installation of the new sewer, electric and water lines to the RV sites on the east side of the Camp. If it had not been for too much rain and the approaching of freezing temps, the work probably would have been finished. Plans are underway for the remainder of the job to be completed, and if the weather cooperates, service should be ready in early May.

Repairing the sod and soil along the route where the lines run, and the final hookup devices requires a lot of work. Can you help?

A great deal of planning is taking place during this off-season. Speakers, musicians, scheduling of Retreats, Workdays, etc., have to be put in place. We are doing a juggling act trying to schedule events and activities so as not to conflict.
